BSNL to offer minimum broadband speed of 2 Mbps from Oct 1

BSNL has decided to upgrade its broadband speed to minimum 2 Mbps at no additional cost for all its broadband customers from October 1. This was announced by Information and Technology Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad at a function in Gurgaon today.

BSNL is the first service provider to provide the broadband access to the country. BSNL launched the broadband services over its landline in India in 2005 with speed of 256 kbps and above over the state-of-the-art multi-protocol label switching (MPLS) based IP infrastructure in urban and rural areas.
